

BakerRipley Neighborhood Restoration Centers

- In collaboration with the City of Houston and Harris County, BakerRipley expanded services from January 2018 through January 2019 at the community centers after Hurricane Harvey so residents can get more information and connection to resources in the community that can help them in their recovery efforts as well as establish plans for the resiliency of the neighborhood.
- BakerRipley's support for long-term disaster recovery models the organization's unique approach to community development – a strengths-based approach focused on working closely with residents to bring initiatives supporting the community's needs and aspirations.
- The centers will have the following common elements in the areas of support:
 - 1) Outreach, engagement and assessment of the neighborhood
 - 2) Disaster recovery information and resources for neighbors
 - 3) Workshops & special events held in the neighborhoods
 - 4) Direct assistance services (provided by a number of partners) for the neighborhood
- The efforts of the BakerRipley Community Centers include a strong collaboration with other disaster recovery-focused organizations, the business community, government agencies and volunteer groups.
- The BakerRipley-operated Neighborhood Restoration Centers are funded by BakerRipley and the Hurricane Harvey Relief Fund, a relief fund established by the Mayor of Houston and the Harris County Judge and administered by the Greater Houston Community Foundation.

- BakerRipley is operating restoration centers in six communities. Neighbors impacted by Hurricane Harvey can find information, workshops and connection to resources to help them in their recovery.
